About Tri-color Personal Student Responders

Teachers can use the green, yellow, and red response tents in their classroom to get immediate and differentiated feedback from students ... and then use that information to differentiate instruction, group students, optimize instructional time, and much, much more.

Green = "I understand."

Yellow = "I'm not sure ... I think I may need some help or clarification."

Red = "I don't understand. Could we go over it again?"

For a temporary message, students can use a dry erase marker and wipe it off when finished. Here are some other ideas for how these student response cards can be used ... the sky's the limit!


What is the answer? A (green), B (yellow), C (red) or True (green), False (red)


Do you agree that _____?
agree (green), undecided/not sure (yellow), disagree (red)

What is the character's mood? positive (green), neutral (yellow), negative (red)

How do you feel today? great (green), so-so (yellow), bad (red)

What is the slope? positive (green), zero (yellow), negative (red), undefined (open end of responder or hide responder)





Students: How to Make and Use Your Personal Responder Tent

- 1) Fold the card along the lines where 2 colors meet so that the colors are on the outside surface.
- 2) Tape the top of the green edge to the bottom of the red edge.
- 3) Place the card on your desk with the color you want to communicate facing your teacher.
